Check-in and accommodation

- Directions to Camp Collins AND a map of Camp Collins are attached here or available on-line: http://ymcacw.org/locations/ymca-camp-collins/campcollins.html.
- Plan to arrive at Camp Collins between 5pm and 10pm on Thursday. When you do, please go to Jessie's Lodge for your room assignment. If you arrive after we've gone to bed, find a bunk in the Randall hobbit house.
- Lodging is included for Thursday and Friday nights.
- The group will be housed in the Rotary Village "Hobbit Houses". Each building has an open floor plan with 14 twin beds and toilet/sink facilities. Shower facilities are located in the nearby Rotary bathhouse.
- Each house will have a clipboard and sign-up sheet outside the front door. When you choose your bunk, please add your name to the list so everyone knows the spot is taken. If you are arriving late; please check to see if there are bunks available before disturbing the occupants.
- Burns House will be for those who snore; Randall for late arrivals, and Rippey & Jubitz for women only.
- Bedding/towels: Bring your own bedding & pillow (twin mattress) or sleeping bag as well as hand/shower towels.
- If you're arriving on Friday morning, you will find us in the Collins Memorial Lodge beginning at 7:30am.
- We need to completely check out of our rooms on Saturday morning before the field trip begins.
- We need to leave the rooms as we found them (minor cleaning). We've ask for student volunteers to
 coordinate that effort, but you are responsible for leaving your immediate sleeping area the way you found it.

Food & Beverages

- Dinner will NOT be provided on Thursday night. Please plan to eat Thursday dinner before arriving at Camp Collins. The nearest food is a 15-20 minute drive away.
- All meals (Friday breakfast, lunch, dinner, and Saturday breakfast) are included and will be served in the Collins
 Memorial Lodge cafeteria. On Saturday, you'll make sack lunches for the fieldtrip. We are working with the
 cafeteria staff to have vegetarian, dairy-free and/or gluten-free options available for those who indicated a
 dietary restriction.
- Meal times are:
 - o Breakfast (Fri & Sat): 7:30am
 - o Lunch (Fri): noon
 - o Dinner (Fri): 5:30pm
- Hot beverages, including a new coffee system serving Seattle's best are available in the cafeteria for our coffee breaks
- Jessie's Lodge has kitchen and refrigerator for storage of beverages or other necessities for our evening gatherings.
- We'll provide some basic snacks and beverages (alcoholic and non), but please bring your preferred beverages
 for Friday night's post-dinner Extravaganza. Scott Burns is once again generously providing a selection of wines
 for a terroir tasting. Bring your own to compare!
- We are sharing of Camp Collins with other groups; please be sensitive to YMCA policies and discreet about alcohol consumption and disposal of containers.

Connectivity

- There is poor/no cell phone coverage at Camp Collins. In an emergency, the main office number is 503-663-5813, and a pager number is 503-441-2980.
- There is wifi in the cafeteria and possibly the Jessie's lodge, but not in the hobbit houses. Password will be provided on-site.

Field Trip (Saturday)

- We'll depart from Camp Collins for the field trip at 8:30 am on Saturday morning. Everyone needs to have their bags packed and be out of their rooms by 8am. You can stash your stuff in the cafeteria while you eat breakfast.
- We will reconvene at Lewis and Clark State Park at 9am. Vehicles not needed for transportation on the field trip may be left here and we'll shuttle drivers back to collect them at the end of the day. PLEASE CARPOOL!!
